The most recent education policy in Tanzania is the Education and Training Policy of 2014 The policy considered the use of Swahili as instructional language alongside English and introduced a new education structure: 11 years of compulsory basic education (one year pre-primary, six years primary and four years secondary education)

enrollment in ordinary level secondary education increased from 238,194 students in 2000 to 1,466,402 in 2010, which accounted for 249% increase (SEDP II, 2010, MOEVT, 2010 & BEST, 2013) The Ministry of Education sees secondary education expansion as a key weapon in fighting against poverty as the knowledge and skills
